

## Competition rules

## Prize draw organised by LISER, to be drawn in the presence of a bailiff

1. The public institution known as Luxembourg Institute of Socio-Economic Research, herein referred to as “LISER” or “Centre”, located at Maison des Sciences Humaines 11, Porte des Sciences, L-4366 Esch-sur-Alzette/Belval, and represented by its current statutory bodies, is organising a competition in connection with the **Household Finance and Consumption Survey (HFCS) for the resident population and cross-border workers of Luxembourg** (herein referred to as “Survey”).
2. The competition begins from 29 October and ends on 24 December 2021.
3. The competition is open to any person who is part of the above-mentioned survey sample AND who has completed the survey in a correct and consistent manner. The survey must be completed via the INTERNET (<https://hfcs.liser.lu>) by 24 December 2021. Questionnaires completed after the closing date will not be eligible for the competition.
4. Staff (both salaried and independent) who work for the Centre organising the competition, and family members of the aforementioned individuals, may not enter this competition. Only such people as have agreed to take part in the competition shall be included in the draw. A single prize per family shall be awarded (same name and address).
5. The prizes to be won are as follows :

For the resident population in Luxembourg:

- 1 x Prize n° 1 : 1 voucher with a value of 1000€ from Letzshop.lu
- 3 x Prize n° 2 : 1 voucher with a value of 500€ from Letzshop.lu
- 10 x Prize n° 3 : 1 voucher with a value of 250€ from Letzshop.lu
- 50 x Prize n° 4 : 1 voucher with a value of 100€ from Letzshop.lu
- 200 x Prize n° 5 : 1 voucher with a value of 50€ from Letzshop.lu

For the cross-border workers:

- 1 x Prize n° 1 : 1 voucher with a value of 1000€ from Letzshop.lu
- 3 x Prize n° 2 : 1 voucher with a value of 500€ from Letzshop.lu
- 10 x Prize n° 3 : 1 voucher with a value of 250€ from Letzshop.lu
- 50 x Prize n° 4 : 1 voucher with a value of 100€ from Letzshop.lu
- 200 x Prize n° 5 : 1 voucher with a value of 50€ from Letzshop.lu

\*A private household residing in the Belgian, French and German regions of the ‘Grande Région’ where at least one household member has a professional activity in Luxembourg.

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6. The draw will take place during the week of 10 and 14 January 2022, winning entries shall be drawn, in the presence of a bailiff.

A total of five hundred and twenty-eight (528) people shall be drawn and declared to be the winners, subject to their fulfilling the aforementioned conditions.

Should this not be the case, (i.e. incomplete or inconsistent questionnaire, person associated with the lottery or similar (see point 4)), a new draw shall be held immediately, until such time as the prize in question has been awarded to someone who fulfils the aforementioned conditions.

For each of the two categories (resident population of Luxembourg and Cross-Border Workers) The first person drawn will be designated the winner of prize n°1; the next 3 people will be designated the winners of prize n° 2; the next 10 people will be designated the winners of prize n°3 etc. (see point 5).

The winners of the competition will be notified by e-mail by **Letzshop** (see point 11). The service of Mailchimp (The Rocket Science Group LLC) will be used to distribute the prizes by e-mail corresponding to the winning amount following the draw before the Court Bailiff (see point 5 and 6).

7. By entering the competition, competitors agree to be bound by these rules. The full text of the rules has been filed with bailiffs TAPELLA & NILLES, 14-16, rue du Canal, L-4050 Esch/Alzette and can be viewed on their website at [www.tapella-nilles.lu](http://www.tapella-nilles.lu). It is also available on the survey website (<https://hfcs.liser.lu>). The full text of the rules shall be sent by email to all persons entering the competition once their entry has been confirmed.
8. Entry to the competition is free of charge. Entry to the competition is solely as described in the present rules.
9. No complaints can be entertained concerning how the competition is organised, except in the case of gross negligence or wilful misconduct on the part of the head of the Centre. Similarly, the names of the prize-winners drawn can in no case be contested, for any reason whatsoever, except in the case of gross negligence or wilful misconduct.
10. LISER cannot exchange the prizes for other products or services, nor for their value in cash. The allocation of prizes can in no case be contested, for any reason whatsoever, except in the case of gross negligence or wilful misconduct on the part of the head of the Centre.
11. LISER agrees to respect the current regulations concerning data protection.

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LISER collects personal data with the participants' consent, in order to register and manage their draw entries. LISER agrees to use personal data solely for the purposes for which they are collected and to ensure they remain confidential at all times.

LISER will transmit the winners' email addresses to the **service provider Letzshop** in a secure manner in order to carry out the prize distribution. The service of Mailchimp (The Rocket Science Group LLC) will be used to distribute the prizes by email. Each entrant has the right to opt-out of this service.

No other personal data shall be passed on to third party organisations.

Only the winners of the draw will be notified by Letzshop.lu

LISER agrees to tell all those concerned how they can exercise these rights as simply as possible.

All data collected for this competition shall be destroyed by LISER once the lottery is closed.

12. The liability of the Centre and its various bodies, staff and agents in the context of this competition, irrespective of the legal reason, is limited to cases of gross negligence or wilful misconduct.
13. The competition organisers reserve the right to change or interrupt the competition should any major event make it impossible to hold it. Should any clauses be or become invalid, the other entry rules still apply.
14. The competition and any questions concerning the interpretation of its rules are governed by Luxembourg law and subject to the jurisdiction of the Luxembourg courts.

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
